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LIVESTOCK

It is up to the discretion of the fair board to require removal of any livestock that are unmanageable for safety or health reasons.

LIVESTOCK HOUSING

All livestock will be housed in the 4-H building. Livestock will be released as soon as show is over. Everyone is responsible for cleaning up their own area after the show. Saw dust is available for purchase at the fair office. Official livestock schedule will be posted at the beginning of the show.

JACKPOT LIVESTOCK CLASSES

Jackpots will be held for Market Swine, Market Goat, Market Lamb, Feeder Calf, Heifer and Market Steer. Deadline to enter Jackpots is 8:30am. Entry fees are \$10 per head. Each class will have added money. Market Swine jackpot will follow the swine show, all other jackpots will follow the 4-H Livestock Show.
